



**History of the Kings Park Tennis Club
1952 (Ravenhurst) to 2010**

50 Years at King George VI Memorial Reserve

FOREWARD

The following "History of Kings Park Tennis Club" is a summary of important milestones from a review of the minutes of Committee meetings from 1952 to 2010. It is important to note that these achievements, however substantial, do not express the true value of being a member of this club. The experiences and relationships formed as a member are truly what are important and are what sets Kings Park apart from any other club.

From the club's inception as the Ravenhurst Tennis Club, the members of this Club have shown great vision and commitment to achieve the standard of the present complex and the high regard that the club is held within the tennis and general community. It has not always been in the impressive financial and operative position it is today, and remedial action was required on a number of occasions from dedicated individuals to lead the club through the situation. The club also pays tribute to those incredible volunteers through its first 50 years for their countless hours contributed to the success of this club.

Since the 1950's society has changed dramatically and the Club has been able to not only adapt to but thrive within these changes. The relaxation of rules prohibiting Sunday sport, weekend retail trading, greater participation of women in the workforce and the introduction of night tennis have all forced the club to re-evaluate itself.

Social activities have been a major contributor to the fabric of this club, from Crazy Whist Nights and Movie Nights to show Davis Cup Matches in the 1950's to Dinner Dances, Karaoke Nights, Beach Parties, Fashion Parades, Trivia Nights, Calcutta Auction nights of later decades. The club has also participated in reciprocal visits with other clubs initially with the Belgrave Tennis Club and then with the Maffra Lawn Tennis Club, even booking out the entire Metropolitan Hotel for their Easter tournament for a number of years.

A major driving factor in the success of this club has been the Mid-Week members. Not only do they figure prominently in the competition history of the club but they have also provided a significant contribution in fund raising and defining the direction of the club.

The future success of any club is dependent on the structure and opportunities that it provides its junior members. To which over the years the club has developed into one of the leading junior clubs in the region both in terms of total number of teams but also the quality of opportunities provided to them.

Whilst the club is unlikely to field a Premier League team, (although a number of members have gone onto play at that level or beyond), elite competition success has never been the defining measurement for success at this club.

As a community asset, this club can stand proud of its achievements. The clubhouse, the courts, the lights and all associated assets have been paid for by members, they have not been provided by council or government. At times the club has used loan funds from banks, council and Tennis Australia on interest free or at market rate interest to fund its development.

We look forward to an exciting next 50 years!

History of Kings Park Tennis Club

Ravenhurst Era

A meeting was held on Friday January 18, 1952 for the purpose of forming a tennis club. The meeting was held at the Ravenhurst Tennis Courts, a private establishment operated by Mr. (Cr.) G R Bricker. Mr Bricker suggested that a temporary committee be formed and called for nominations. Mr. R Williamson was elected President, Mr. G Mactaggart was elected Secretary, Mr E C Knight was elected Treasurer and Mr F O'Keefe & Mrs Mactaggart elected Court Captains.

Mr Williamson outlined the arrangements that the club was able to hire courts from the Ravenhurst Tennis Courts at the full day rate of £1/1/-. This would entitle use of the courts between 9.00am and 12 noon and again between 1.30pm and 6.00pm.

As the maximum number of courts that was allowed to be hired was five it was agreed that the club be limited to 100 members, (20 players per court). Tennis Balls were to be supplied by the proprietors at the rate of 5/6 per box.

It was agreed at this meeting that a series of trials would be held, culminating in a tournament, that would establish a standard acceptable for club membership.

The proprietor, Mr Bricker suggested that the name of the club be "**Ravenhurst Tennis Club**", and this was agreed at the meeting.

At the first Annual General Meeting held on 11 March 1952 it was agreed that membership fees would be set as follows:

Entrance Fee	£2/2/-
Membership Fees	£1/10/- per quarter
Ball Fees	£1 per player per day
Visitors Fees	2/6 plus £1/ ball fee per day

In April 1952 the club entered its first competition teams, a B Special Mixed team and a B Grade Mens team in the Brighton and Districts Lawn Tennis Association.

The first club social event was a Crazy Whist card night at the home of the O'Keefe's, with an admission price of £2 and "supper to be provided by the ladies". It was also agreed in June 1952 that a projector be hired to enable the screening of a copy of the 1952 Davis Cup film that had been donated to the club.

In July 1952 a formal constitution, rule and bylaws of the club was approved by the members and became operational. The constitution required all players to be graded as either "A" or "B" grade and that a list be placed on the noticeboard, to be reviewed each month.

In October 1952, it was agreed that the Club hold monthly tournaments on the second Sunday of each month, and that competitions teams would practice on the last Sunday of each month. In December 1952 it was agreed that each member would be allotted a handicap that would be used in monthly tournaments.

As at October 1952, the club was using 4 courts on Saturdays, 3 courts on Sunday's on 1 court under lights on Thursday nights. Night Tennis in 1952!!!!!!
At the end of the first year of operation the club had a bank balance of £95/0/7.

In March 1953 the club received a payment order to the value of £2/2 as prize money for the Mixed team winning their section in the BRLTA.

In May 1953, "Ravenhurst Juniors" commenced under the guidance of Mr A Strachan and Mr Bricker. Upon achieving a suitable standard they would be admitted as members to the main club.

In September 1953, the club informed BRLTA that if our top team was not included in the top section for the Summer season, the club would no longer enter teams in BRLTA and would in future enter teams in SDLTA ("Southern Districts"). The club also entered its first team in the mid-week section of SDLTA.

In October 1953, it was proposed that a club blazer be created at a cost of £6/17/6 each.

In 1954 the Committee considered a report that one of our teams deliberately lost points in order to achieve a more favourable position in the finals. This was considered unsportsmanlike and was not to be tolerated again.

By 1954 the club was entering 6 teams in the BRLTA on Saturdays.

In March 1954, the club affiliated with the LTAV and entered its first pennant team.

In November 1954, an item was considered by the committee to reduce the number of competition teams as it was interfering with Sunday social tennis, and a requirement that those players playing in the LTAV pennant competition be required to play for the club in the Summer competition.

In 1955 the club entered its first ladies LTAV Pennant team on a Saturday morning.

In 1955 the club entered its first weekend teams in SDLTA, also continuing to play in the BDLTA.

In July 1955, the club decided that all future teams would be entered in SDLTA.

In the Summer season of 1955 the club entered 5 mixed teams and 2 mens teams in SDLTA.

In Winter 1956 the club Section 11 team won the Butterworth Cup.

In 1957 the committee decided that all Club Championship matches be a third set advantage with finals being three advantage sets!

In February 1957 the new proprietor of the tennis courts increased the court hire fees by 33%, after negotiation this was reduced to a 16.5% increase.

By 1958, annual subscriptions had increased to £7 per annum and concerns had begun about the standard of the courts at Ravenhurst.

At the 1958 AGM a motion was put to abolish handicapping at the monthly tournaments. This motion was defeated.

By May 1960, club membership had decreased to 46 members and only £170 in the bank. A conference between the committee and the proprietor resolved to reduce the number of courts hired to 3 (down from a maximum of 7 a few years ago).

“It was reported in the local press that a number of Bowling clubs were using Council land, free of rates for their activities. In view of this it was moved by Doug Hunt and seconded by Ken Muzzell that an approach be made to the City of Moorabbin authorities regarding the possibility of obtaining council land and the financial assistance which would be needed to set up the Club’s own courts.”

In August 1960 it was reported that in a meeting with Mr. Bricker, it was suggested that the Club buy the fencing materials and that members should provide the labour for the erection of the fence and to prepare the ground to the ashes stage. Mr Bricker offered to supply the Club with second hand materials for the clubhouse.

Of the alternative sites available Mr Bricker favoured the Halley Reserve site.

A quote of £1,250 was received for the construction of 3 courts from the ashes stage. It was suggested that quotes should also be obtained for the complete laying of 3 courts. The financing of the project was discussed and the following suggestions made:

1. the finance be provided , partly by debentures and the remainder by a Council loan; or
2. That a short term loan be obtained, debentures to be used a security.

To continue negotiations a sub-committee was formed, consisting of, Doug Jolly, Don Bowley, Ken Muzzell, Doug Hunt and Ken Tresize.

A quote of between £1,800 and £2,000 was received for the complete laying of 3 courts.

It was subsequently determined that the Halley Park option was unavailable until mid-1961. However there was a possibility that land at King George Park in Boundary Road would be available. It was decided to inspect the site before a final decision was reached.

The finance problem has been discussed with certain members of the council and it was suggested that the council may decide to build the courts themselves and then charge the club rent until the cost of the courts had been repaid after which a nominal amount would be charged.

At a special meeting of the club, the chairman of the Building Sub-Committee updated the members pointing out that a grant of land for the courts had been made by the Moorabbin Council and that considerable help with building materials procurement had been promised by Mr Don Bricker. He stated that a bank loan of £1,000 could be obtained and the remaining £500 needed for the project would be raised by the issue of 50 £10 debentures to the members of the club. These debentures would carry a 4% interest rate and would be redeemable after 5 years.

He also explained that support would be required from members for several weekends to assist in levelling the courts and fencing operations and later for the erection of the Clubhouse.

Mr Trezise then addressed the financial side of the project and pointed out that the terms of the bank loan were very satisfactory. He said that the loan and debenture repayment commitments could be met by the club without raising fees.

Mr Muzzell stressed that if the club decided to continue with the project then no time should be lost, as the present position at Ravenhurst was unsatisfactory.

The decision to proceed with the project was made after a show of hands indicated that the club members would give their support to the committee. It was stated that the name of the club would have to be altered when it moved to the new courts and a suggestion that it be called "**Kings Park Tennis Club**" was approved by the members present.

Within two weeks the debentures had been oversubscribed with offers totalling £530 received for the required £500. The lease documentation (for a 7 year lease) was received from the City of Moorabbin, to which, after much discussion it was agreed that the terms were quite reasonable. The Council also requested that the club nominate trustees for the lease.

The trustees elected were:

Don Bowley
Bob Knight
Ken Muzzell
Ken Trezise

The club agreed to get legal advice in regard to obligations of the trustees and the leasehold.

It was advised that the club had already been approached by a professional tennis coach, but it was decided to defer any consideration at that point in time.

It was found that the new lease could be signed in the name of Ravenhurst Tennis Club but if this was done a payment of £6 would have to be made when the club changed its name.

The alternative was for the name of the club to be changed prior to signing the lease or that a new club be launched and all business concerning the project be in the new club's name.

It was decided to launch the new club as the Ravenhurst constitution did not allow for funds to be raised for the construction of new courts.

King George VI Memorial Reserve Era

On December 6, 1960 the Kings Park Tennis Club was founded and all committee members of the previous Ravenhurst Tennis Club were appointed to the initial committee of the new club, with the additional of Mr D Bricker as an additional Vice President.

A lot of preparatory work had been done on a new Constitution for the club, involving examining the Ravenshurst and Oakleigh Tennis Club Constitutions. A new Constitution was approved by the members and came into effect on December 6, 1960.

It was approved that all members of the Ravenshurst Tennis Club be admitted to membership of the Kings Park Tennis Club without the payment of a joining fee.

In January 1961, the committee approved the purchase of 4,000 bricks for £32 to enable the members to commence the construction of the back retaining wall plus the surroundings of the three court area. It was also decided to build an additional level of brick to stop the loss of court topping around the perimeter. At the same time the members would install agricultural pipes to enable drainage of excess water. Enquiries also commenced concerning tapping of mains water.

In June 1961 the contract for the construction of the courts was awarded to Horwood Construction Co for a value of £1,225. Members had previously completed the project to the base ashes stage.

It was decided to delay the final movement from Ravenhurst to King George VI Reserve until July 1 1961.

In August 1961, the committee approved a new syllabus that set out the details of fees, times of play for differing classes of membership, times for coaching and external hire. The hiring fee would be 5/- per head per half day.

In September 1961 it was decided to assist court drainage to install an open drain at the rear of the courts.

In November 1961 a member roster system to water the courts over summer was introduced.

In early 1962 a Ladies Mid-Week Club was formed.

A large packing case was erected as an outside shelter.

The courts were officially opened on Sunday June 10, 1962, attended by the Mayor and Ward Councillors.

A neighbour in Kalimna Street was appointed caretaker of the courts and collected visitor's fees and kept the gate keys for member access.

At the AGM on July 1962 Mr, E C (Bob) Knight was awarded Life Membership.

In December 1962 it was decided to extend the water piping from the end of the court to the middle (in between the courts).

In May 1963 2 junior teams were entered in SDTA,

By August 1963 the loan had been reduced to £100.

The debt was fully repaid by February 1964.

Membership fees in 1964 were:

Adults	£5 per annum
Juniors	£2/10/0 per annum
Joining Fee	£2/2/0 (adult)
	£1/1/0 (junior)

In August 1964 the club enters its first team in the Caulfield Carrum Tennis Association, junior sections on Saturday mornings

In Winter 1963 Section 10 won the Butterworth Cup (SDTA).

In November 1964 a sub committee is formed to examine the possible funding and construction of a fourth court. At this date there are 47 members and a bank balance of £718 with £480 owed to debenture holders.

By February 1965 a Mid Week Ladies Committee had been established, with a representative to be part of the main club's committee.

In April 1965 a party of 30 venture to Maffra Tennis Club for their Easter Tournament for the first time. As a result there were regular social tournaments with the two clubs at alternating between Melbourne and Maffra through to the 1990's.

The fourth court was completed in August 1965 and funded by a new issue of unsecured notes and the addition support of existing debenture holders who had agreed to rollover the debenture maturity date. The total cost for the new court was £675.

In December 1965 the club changed tennis coaches from Mr Brian Berry to Mr Trevor Nette.

In January 1966 upgrades to the clubhouse commenced to include hot showers to allow teams to participate in LTAV pennant in the coming winter season.

In June 1966, Club Captain, Mr George Mathews dies on court and the committee agree that a perpetual trophy will be named in his honour in regard to the monthly Sunday tournaments.

At the AGM in July 1967, when membership was 48 senior members, 31 competition midweek members, 20 midweek social players, 17 intermediate members and 12 juniors a total of 118, it was first mentioned the possibility of building a further 2 courts. At this time the club had \$1,600 in the bank, although debentures were owe to members of approximately \$800.

In October 1967 a quote for the construction of 2 new courts was tabled at a committee meeting for \$2,535.00.

The club obtained a bank loan for the construction of the new courts, a loan guaranteed personally by a councillor from the City of Moorabbin, Cr McHutchinson.

Construction commenced in March 1968 and was completed in September 1968. The complex then consisted of 6 courts. A water bore was also sunk during this period to ensure adequate supply of water during summer months. A total cost of \$400 was paid for by a levy on all members.

In June 1968 SDTA wrote the club reconfirming that male tennis players must wear all white clothing while ladies may wear pastel colours!

At the AGM in July 1968 "Tea Stewardesses" were elected!

In October 1968 there was an opening gala party at the East Bentleigh Hall to celebrate the opening of the new courts. Over 100 people attended.

In November 1968 a new lease was drawn up covering an extra 4 feet to the north, to allow a paling fence wind break to be constructed.

In August 1969 the committee imposed a \$0.05 "tea levy" on competition players.

In 1972 the club was in a perilous financial position mainly due to the amount of outstanding membership fees, the Club Treasurer, Mr Robert Thompson, spent a good many weekends door knocking as debt collector to return the club to a safe position.

In August 1972 it was decided not to proceed with a letter to council in regard to additional land for a new clubhouse.

19 September 1972 the minutes of a committee meeting state that "initial discussions were well underway"

In October 1972 plans were outlined for extensions to the clubhouse.

In December 1972 the minutes state "The plan has been decided on by the Committee and approved in principle by the Council, the only matter outstanding is the glass window frontages, which will be referred to the Committee at the next meeting"

In February 1973 Mr Barry Tonsing is appointed as Club Coach.

In September 1973 the SDTA wrote to the club seeking payment of a fee they stated was overdue since 1960!!!!

In June 1973 a local builder was invited to look over the clubhouse to advise on possible renovations and extension.

In July 1973 quotes for the clubhouse extension were for approximately \$8,000.

In July 1973 at the AGM that went to 10.45pm an alternative was put forward for a cream brick veneer new clubhouse to be a total area of 20 feet X 25 feet.

In August 1973 the quote for renovating the old clubhouse had increased to \$12,000 and it was decided to progress with a plan to demolish the old clubhouse and construct a new clubhouse.

The minutes of meeting held between September 1973 and May 1975 were badly affected by fire when clubhouse was broken into and attempted to set fire to it

In 1973 members of the Wraysbury Tennis Club merged with Kings Park.

At a committee meeting in October 1973 attended by 3 councillors from the city of Moorabbin, Cr Alexander, Cr Rainsford and Cr McHutchinson, the councillors informed that although it was not council policy to lend money to sporting clubs, on this occasion they were prepared to lend \$10,000 to the club on an interest free basis repayable over 10 years at \$70 per month.

Council would need to approve plans prior the loan coming into effect.

By April 1974 plans were ready to be sent to Architects to formalise building drawings and preliminary estimate had increased to \$15,000. A local newspaper article had stated that the council had withdrawn funding for the project, but this proved to be false and the council had in fact increased their loan facility to match the \$15,000 cost.

By May 1974 the proposed cost of the new clubhouse had increased to \$32,000 and members were asked for suggestions as to how to reduce the costs down to \$20,000.

In May 1974 a final plan was adopted by the committee and discussions were held with local builders.

In June 1974 the City of Moorabbin advised that the project was to be placed on hold until at least October 1974 when the new council could consider it, and directed that the club not enter into any final arrangements even if the club could arrange bridging finance.

At the AGM in July 1974 the President (Mr Tresize) advised that plans were being drawn up and the overall clubhouse would be between 12.5 squares and 13 squares in area with an additional 6 feet of veranda along the front of the building. The new building will be a solid grey brick construction with an interior of white brick.

Mr Trezise states that in October the loan application will go to council and if approved the fund \$15,000 would be available in January 1975, the club would also seek bridging finance from the bank and commencement of the building can begin.

By November 1974 the loan from the council had been approved and the club would finance the balance. Work was expected to commence in January 1975.

Construction commenced in the last week of January and the slab was laid in the first week of February 1975.

On Sunday 21 September 1975, The Mayor of Moorabbin Cr G.R. Bricker officially opened the new clubhouse. In his speech the Mayor commented that the building, which was first-class in all aspects, is a credit both to the City of Moorabbin and its citizens and particularly

to the members of the Kings Park Tennis Club. Cr Bricker & Mrs Bricker were accompanied by the immediate past Mayor Cr McHutkinson and Mrs McHutkinson.

In April 1976 Mr Colin Price was appointed as Club Coach a position he still holds today some 34 years later (as at December 2010).

In 1976 the club successfully applied for a BYO liquor licence.

In 1978 the old clubhouse was demolished and removed from the side of Court 1 and the area grassed and new outdoor furniture installed.

In 1978 the remodelling of the King George VI Memorial Reserve commenced with paved roads and parking together with substantial landscaping. The entrance to the Tennis Club was moved from the double gates near the current BBQ to the other side of the new clubhouse.

Light poles were erected during a Wednesday when Mid-Week ladies tennis was being played. Alas, one lady member did not notice the new poles placed strategically behind her car when she was backing back, until it was too late!!

In 1978 carpet tiles were laid in the clubhouse. The tiles were supposed to have a lifespan of 5 years but are still in place today (Dec 2010).

In 1980 an automatic sprinkler system was installed for the six courts to allow for watering overnight and at other times when needed. This ended the tradition of families being rostered on to water the courts over the summer breaks!

The courts have suffered severe damage on a number of occasions through flood or wind damage. Several times it was a herculean task by many volunteers (both male and female members) to return the court surface to playing condition.

In May 1984 the club approached the members of the East Boundary Uniting Church Tennis Club about creating one club, but this approach was not well received.

During the period through to 1985 there was a concerted effort to improve the financial position of the club and abide by the terms of the loan with the City of Moorabbin. In 1985 the club repaid the final amount to the Council.

As a result of increased member numbers, at this point in time planning commenced for further extensions to the clubhouse and/or lighting being installed to the courts. At this time the cost of lighting the courts was estimated at \$14,200.

A series of set-backs with council approvals and lack of finances deferred plans. The club concentrated on maintaining and improving existing facilities.

In July 1985 "Hazels Hut" was installed at the rear of Court 5 to provide shelter and viewing for those playing on Courts 5 & 6.

In May 1986 a further approach to the East Boundary Uniting Church Tennis Club was made about merging, but this too was unsuccessful.

In 1987 the club approached the Council in regard to gaining additional land where the current BBQ area is, and this was granted by the council, providing the club did all the work to relocate the fence ourselves and to the same standard as the council would have done. This was completed at a Sunday Working Bee.

At the AGM in 1987 a new Constitution for the club was adopted and the club became an Incorporated Association.

During the period 1986 to 1998 the club continued to work on plans for the lighting of the courts and maintaining club assets.

After a much needed fence replacement program, the clubs funds were once again very low. New President, Mark Thompson, lead the renewal leading a massive Trash & Treasure effort that raised over \$4,000 and the club has not looked back since.

In 1988 the construction of a new BBQ area was completed and named after Ray Burley.

During the 1980's and 1990's the club conducted a series of very successful social activities that further developed the social fabric of the club, which is still evident and thriving today. Examples of which are:

Invitational Tournaments with surrounding clubs, fancy dress and whistle stop tournaments and Melbourne Cup Calcutta nights and tournaments, a highlight being Mark Thompson's Phantom Calls and some very exuberant betting on teams. These complemented the existing traditions of end of season presentations and the club championship final night.

The club also participated in the inaugural Tennis Open Day and won high praise from Tennis Victoria for the effort that the club went to, even including a dunking machine on Court 2 and a radar speed gun to test how fast your serves really were!

The Mid-Week Ladies managed the project of re-equipping the clubhouse with padded chairs, as the lifespan of the original plastic orange and blue chairs was well expired. Testament to their search, the chairs is still in great condition and well used today, (December 2010).

In 1998 the club sought documentation from a supplier to go to the council to again seek permission to install lights on the courts. In September 1999 the council confirmed to the club in writing that we had met all the conditions and that the project was approved.

Construction commenced on October 7, 1999 and was stopped at the direction from council after receipt of notice of legal action against the club and council on November 4. At this point in time the project was complete but we were unable to turn the lights on.

The Club was then required to submit a planning application to Council, even though the Council had confirmed in writing that no planning permit was required. After a public meeting at the council chambers where the club and the residents were able to put their case to council, the planning permit was approved.

The residents decided to take the Council decision to VCAT, but after a hearing at VCAT the planning application was approved although slightly scaled back to use from Monday – Thursday only, and only until 10.00pm.

In 1999 the club upgraded its BYO licence to a restricted club licence and constructed bar facilities, and hence BARMUIDA was established.

In 1999 the East Boundary Uniting Tennis Club merged with Kings Park to make an eight court complex.

On 4 September 2000 the lighted courts were officially open in a ceremony attended by Councillors for the City of Glen Eira, guests from Tennis Australia and Tennis Victoria and Australian Davis Cup Captain John Fitzgerald.

The total project had been financed by a loan from Tennis Australia of \$16,000 and funds generated from the club of \$20,000. The club was also awarded a Victorian Government grant for the purchase of padding around the light poles.

Whilst the traditional first Sunday of the month has been phased out, Night Tennis began and continued to grow with Ladies Doubles Competition on Tuesday nights, Mixed On Wednesday nights and coaching and club member usage on most nights.

In 2003 Colin Price was named Coach of the Year by the TCAV.

In October 2008 the final four courts were lit and were officially opened by Ian Collins a life member of KPTC.

During the 1990's and 2000's the club participated in a number of successful come and play tennis days with the VTA and also upgraded its status to a level three of the "Good Sports" Program. The club also introduces a well received "junior sleepover" night with guests such as Peter Luczak

In 2009 in partnership with the City of Glen Eira and the State Government the club received a Water Tank for additional water storage to aid with the current drought conditions. The club also applied Magnesium Chloride to the courts to assist in water retention.

During 2009 Colin Price was inducted into the TCAV "Hall of Fame" and in tribute the club decided to rename Court One as "Colin Price Court"

During 2009 and 2010 plans have been preparing for the extension and refurbishment of the clubhouse and to replace the fencing around the top six courts, court seven and eight were replaced in 2007.

In 2010 the refurbishment has begun with the Ceiling to Floor Windows being installed and a new Plasma TV installed.

What will the next 50 years bring?
